Pursuant to Section 5 of the NFPA Regulations Governing Committee Projects, the National Fire Protection Association has issued the following Tentative Interim Amendment to NFPA 1994, *Standard on Protective Ensembles for First Responders to CBRN Terrorism Incidents*, 2007 edition. The TIA was processed by the Technical Committee on Hazardous Materials Protective Clothing and Equipment, and was issued by the Standards Council on June 4, 2007, with an effective date of June 24, 2007.

A Tentative Interim Amendment is tentative because it has not been processed through the entire standards-making procedures. It is interim because it is effective only between editions of the standard. A TIA automatically becomes a proposal of the proponent for the next edition of the standard; as such, it then is subject to all of the procedures of the standards-making process.

1. *Make the following changes in Chapter 4, Certification:*

4.1.9 The certification organization shall not permit any manufacturer to continue to label any products that are certified as compliant with the 2001 edition of NFPA 1994, *Standard on Protective Ensemble for Chemical/Biological Terrorism Incidents*, on or after 1 ~~March~~ October 2007.

4.1.10 The certification organization shall require manufacturers to remove all certification labels and product labels indicating compliance with the 2001 edition of NFPA 1994, *Standard on Protective Ensemble for Chemical/Biological Terrorism Incidents*, from all products that are under the control of the manufacturer on 1 ~~March~~ October 2007, and the certification organization shall verify this action is taken.
