19-4-13	Consider the request of Preet Bassi, Center for Public Safety Excellence, Inc., and Denis Onieal, US Fire Administration, to develop a standard on fire service analysts and informational technical specialists professional qualifications. Thirty-four (34) comments were received. Thirty-four (34) comments supported development of the project, zero (0) comment did not support the development of the project. Fourteen (14) technical committee applications have been received to-date.
